## Community Impact Statement

The Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council writes to express our urgent and unwavering opposition to the Department of Housing and Urban Developments' new proposed rule to evict mixed status households from Section 8 and public housing. This is another blatant attack on our immigrant communities, and an attack on public housing resources. We demand that our city officials take action to not only protect our mixed status households, but to also protect our public housing sites by securing funding for our public housing sites.

## Findings:

- **WHEREAS** Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Secretary Scott Turner announced a new [proposed rule](#) to evict households of mixed status, and launched a hotline to report neighbors of suspected mixed status. <https://www.hud.gov/news/hud-no-26-015>
- **WHEREAS** The language used in HUD’s official announcement includes violent rhetoric such as “ illegal aliens” and “fraudsters”. The current administration continues to perpetuate harmful and false narratives, misinformation about HUD’s rules and processes, and continues to target our immigrant communities.
- **WHEREAS** The current existing public housing sites in our communities, namely William Mead - the oldest public housing site in Los Angeles, is currently under attack from HACLA as it is facing demolition, and conversion to public-private partnerships.
- **WHEREAS** The city of Los Angeles has development plans to eliminate all public housing sites from our city, as seen with Jordan Downs, and therefore eliminating the only type of publicly funded, permanently affordable housing model in our city. <https://knock-la.com/los-angeles-war-on-public-housing-introduction/>
- **WHEREAS** the City of Los Angeles has experienced ICE raids and our city elected officials have failed to hold up ICE agent mask bans, sanctuary city laws, and due process; our policies and administration continue to harm our most vulnerable neighbors, and persecute the immigrant community.
- **WHEREAS** “Today, households with eligible and ineligible members (such as undocumented people) can live together, but ineligible members don’t get government assistance. - **WHEREAS** this policy would evict over 100,000 people, including children, in an era where we are already experiencing a housing crisis. - **WHEREAS** the Trump administration previously attempted to enact this rule, however failed due to public outcry.

## Be it resolved, we demand

1. Our city officials pass an interim city ordinance for a moratorium to protect our mixed status families from eviction.

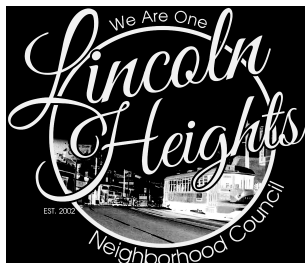

Re: Centro CSO Member and Teamster, Sergio Flores' charges

We, the **Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council** declare that on **March 5, 2026**, a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held by the **Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council** with a quorum of 14 board members present and that by a vote of :

The Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council writes to express our deep opposition to the recent charges against community organizer, Sergio Flores. We believe in our constitutional right to protest, to take up space on public sidewalks, and to exist in our communities without the fear of prosecution. We believe the charges brought onto Sergio Flores are arbitrary, and an attempt to intimidate and neutralize our community from exercising our freedoms. We strongly request that ALL charges against Sergio Flores be dropped.

Findings:

- **WHEREAS** On February 18th after a community meeting located at the Boyle Heights City Hall ended, LAPD Hollenbeck Division ambushed and brutally attacked over a dozen of Centro CSO members with batons and arrested three members in the parking lot of the building.

- **WHEREAS** three community members were arrested, Lindsey Palma, a minor, Sam Carrerra and Sergio Flores. After public community pressure, all of the detainees were released.
- **WHEREAS** Sergio Flores faces felony charges despite no evidence. Sergio Flores was attacked and arrested, for simply attending a community meeting in Boyle Heights.

**Be it resolved, we demand**

1. All charges to be dropped against Sergio Flores.

**Be it further resolved,**

2. We request an investigation regarding LAPD's attack on the Boyle Heights Community that occurred on February 18, 2026.

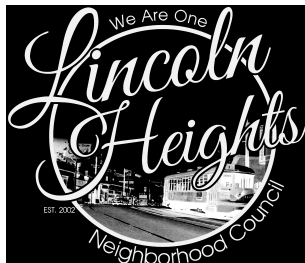

The Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council writes to express our urgent concern and deep opposition to the recent notice posted by LADOT on the premises of parking lot no. 697 located on 2330 Workman Street. We have been notified by several constituents of the adverse economic impact this will have on residents and business owners/operators. The Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council requests clarification on how this decision came to be, clarification as to when public comment was held for this decision, and is asking for this decision to go back to committee for re-deliberation. Further, our Neighborhood Council stands in **opposition to** these new instilled fees for what is now free community parking.

### Findings:

- **WHEREAS** The notice reads: “Beginning March 16, 2026, The City of Los Angeles will implement new parking rate for LADOT free parking facilities including this facility. LOT No. 697. New Parking Rates: \$0.25 per 30 minutes. \$5.00 Daily Maximum.”

- **WHEREAS** This parking lot site has always been free, along with one other on 2414 Workman Street. These free parking sites serve as an accessible and free parking spot for patrons of our small businesses on Broadway, as well as accessible and free overnight parking for residents on this street.
- **WHEREAS** our residents are primarily low income, and working class people who are already burdened with lack of parking, and vulnerable to constant fines. Residents who currently utilize these spots, would have to move their car every two hours and pay for parking every day.
- **WHEREAS** communities like ours are disenfranchised by the lack of parking and therefore inherently susceptible to Parking Tickets at a disproportionate rate.
- **WHEREAS** According to the Los Angeles Department of Transportation data set of 2025, Boyle Heights, our neighboring community, lead the chart with the most parking tickets cited in all of the city of Los Angeles. Lincoln Heights is at no. 6 on this chart that encompasses all LADOT territories of Los Angeles. - **WHEREAS** these policies continue to excessively target our disenfranchised, economically disadvantaged communities; these proposed parking fees will result in our residents being the subject to an increase of arbitrary parking fees, further economically burdening our working class constituents.
- **WHEREAS** our Broadway Business corridor, home to some of the oldest businesses in Los Angeles, relies on these parking spaces so that patrons continue to support our legacy businesses.

**Be it resolved, we demand**

1. This decision to be brought to the Transportation Committee for official public comment

**Be it further resolved,**

2. This decision to be rescinded, and continue with our current model of **Free Parking Lots**.

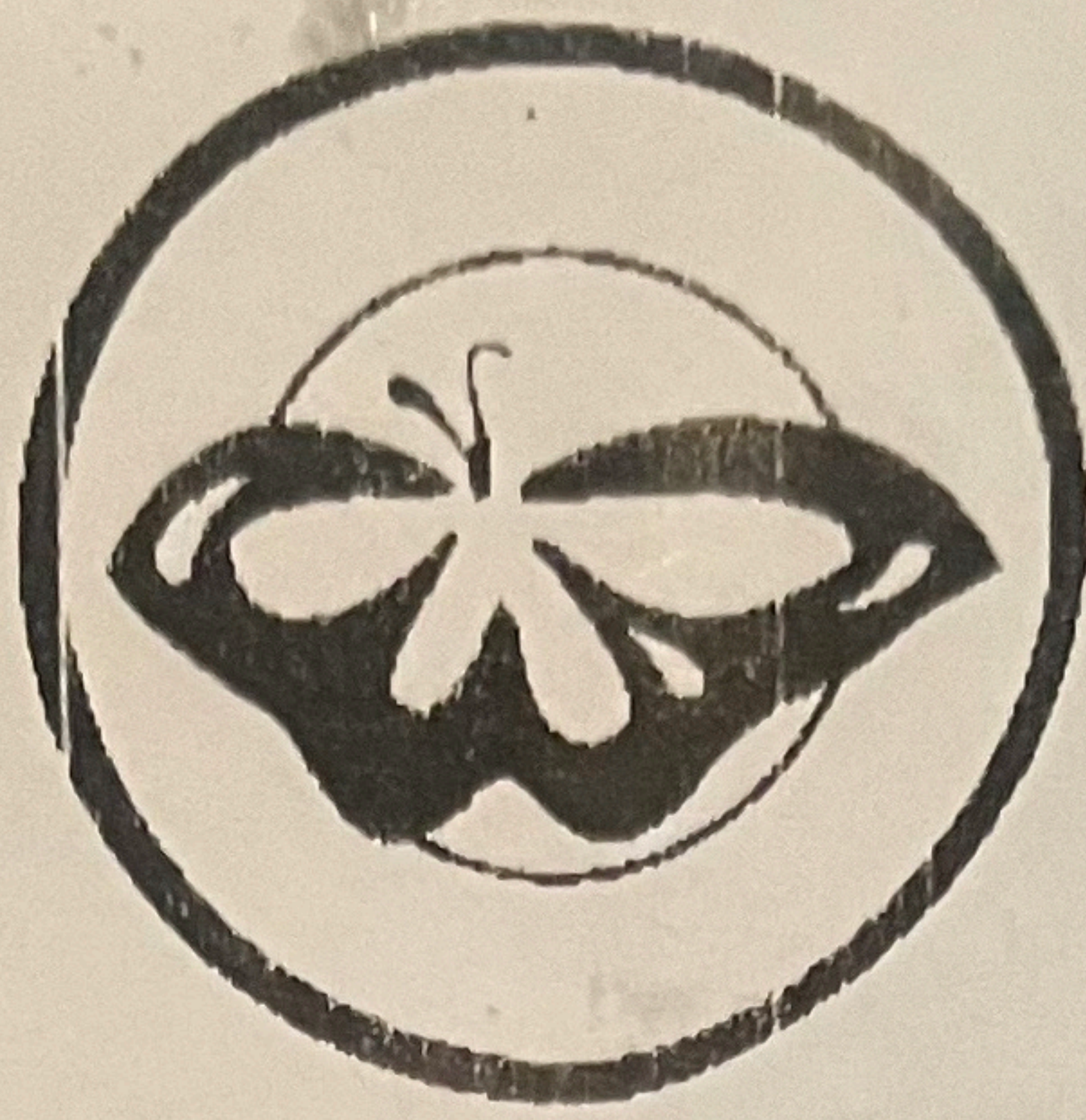

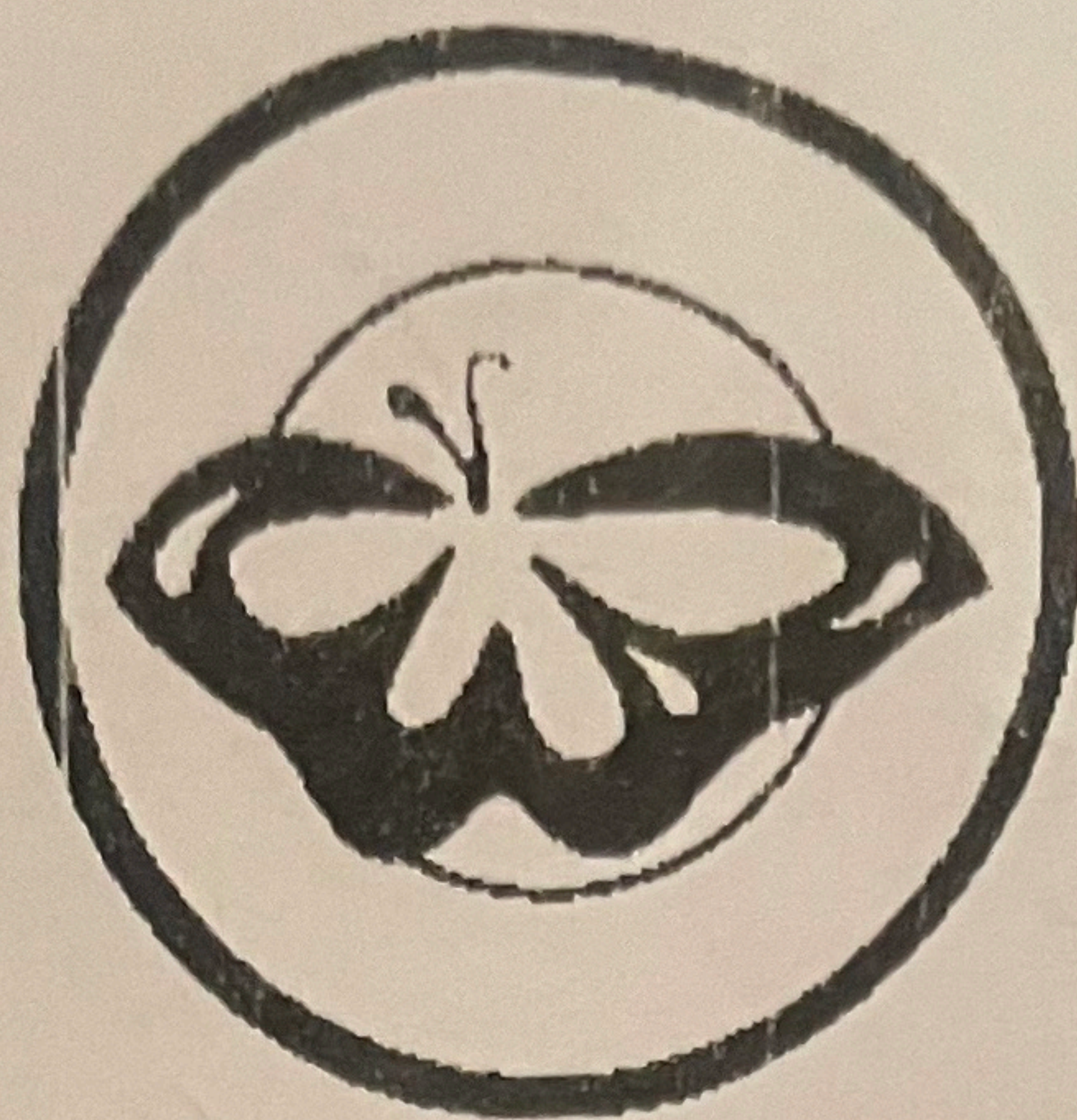
